After graduating from Cooperative Arts & Humanities High School, Mary attended Smith College, where she majored in Political Science (International Relations) and minored in Education, graduating in 2016. Her time at Smith was enriched by her love for the arts, as she actively participated in the Smith College Glee Club, Chamber Singers, and Orchestra.

Mary's passion for the arts extends far beyond college. As the co-vice president of the Smith College Alum Chorus Board, she is currently planning an international music tour for 2026, fostering connections with alums from diverse backgrounds and bringing people together through the universal language of music. Additionally, she gives back to her community by teaching weekly religious education classes for high school students at her local church. Her dedication to life-affirming theology, especially as it relates to black life and liberation theologies, allows her to explore transformative ways for individuals to connect with faith and spirituality. Since graduating, Mary has continued to pursue her goals with unwavering commitment. She earned a Master of Arts in Sociology and Education from Teachers College, Columbia University, and a Master of Divinity from Yale Divinity School. Mary is now a minister-in-training at the historic St. John's Congregational Church in Springfield, Massachusetts, while also working in student affairs at Smith College. Her ultimate aspiration is to become an ordained minister and theology professor, serving both the Church and academia. Mary is actively preparing her doctoral application materials to take the next steps in her journey.

Reflecting on her scholarship, Mary shares, "Receiving the New Haven Scholarship Fund was a deeply affirming experience. It meant my community believed in me and my ability to succeed. Having this support meant that I had a group of people who both emotionally and financially invested in my dreams and were rooting for me to see them come into fruition."

Mary's advice to future recipients is to embrace change and trust the process of discovering their true passions. "It's never too late to pivot, reimagine your goals, or explore new opportunities. No matter where you start, give yourself permission to evolve, and don't let societal expectations or self-doubt limit your potential."

What can I do? I'm only one person. Whenever I hear or think those words, I remember Jean Paton Lovell. Jean was the founder of the New Haven Scholarship Fund (NHSF). Born and raised in New Haven, she attended Smith College and later became a math teacher in the public schools. Her birth in 1894 marked the beginning of a life dedicated to service and community.

Jean was deeply committed to World Peace—an unwavering belief shaped by the profound losses of World War I—and devoted herself to the idea of helping others. She firmly believed that peace and understanding could flourish through education. Jean was also a steadfast presence for students at the Yale International Student Center. In 1959, she and her husband, George Lovell, took action to bring their vision to life by raising money to establish the NHSF. It was Jean's unwavering determination, character, and vision that transformed this all-volunteer initiative into a reality. Though she never had children of her own, her influence has profoundly touched thousands of lives.

From just eight scholarship recipients in 1959, the Fund has now supported over 12,000 New Haven students in their pursuit of higher education. What began with \$800 in awards has grown to over \$11,000,000 distributed to local students. Jean's dream, born of a single person and a small group of friends, has flourished through generations of dedicated volunteers. So, when someone says, "I'm only one person," I think of Jean. And with great pride, I say that I am one of Jean Lovell's many children.
